Don't forget to keep this date open, as it will be a group effort and competition. If we don't have the numbers we won't have the entries. Pingelly have responded, they are in! Quairading are still discussing.

Northam and Beverley Photography Groups have got together to organise and begin the Annual Wheatbelt Interclub Photo Competition. We'd like to kick off this this competition with a rally involving each club interested in participating at a social event in York on Sunday 2nd of April (2pm) finishing at 5.30pm with a social BBQ (byo). More details will follow once we learn of your interest to participate.

The idea is to get together to introduce everyone and then start shooting. A challenge has already been set which will be shared on the day. Those shots taken on the day would then be sorted into each clubs top 10 photos (done at your own club, in your club time). Those top 10 photos from each club would then be sent via email to our official organiser digitally to be presented at another social event in Beverley on Saturday 3rd of June at 2pm to be judged.

The winning group would then set the subject for the competition in the following year. No prizes, just the glory of being the best group in the Wheatbelt on the day.

Objectives

Social interaction with all levels of like-minded photography enthusiasts with the aim of learning together to develop photographic skills and for the promotion of photography in the local area.

Times

Workshops: Last Sat/Sun of every alternate month (unless otherwise stated).

Meeting: Last Tuesday evening of each alternate month following the work-

shop event and held at the Riverside Hotel. Dining commences at 6pm in support of the Hotel which offers the NPG the back room for

our meetings free of charge. Meetings start at 7.30pm.

Rules

An Open and a Workshop competition are held bimonthly.

Open:

The topic for the open category is announced at the beginning of contest period and images can have been taken at any time.

The photograph must have been captured by the submitting photographer.

Workshop:

The entered images for competition must be taken within the time frame of a workshop "location" shoot (No re photographing at another time) unless the workshop is a "learning workshop" where participants can practice what they have learnt and submit their entries between the workshop and the entry cut off. All entries must follow the format outlined below.

Both Open & Workshop

Photographers may submit up to 2 images in each category (ie: 2 in Workshop and 2 in Open) unless otherwise stated.

All images entered will be digital and not print.

Images can be presented with any treatments (Photoshop, black/ white, sepia etc.).

Images are to be emailed to Jenny Utting at <u>jmu@westnet.com.au</u> by the Friday night preceding the Tuesday meeting date.

Images need to be an email size of around 1920 pixels per inch for the highest read.

Images are to be named using the following

Year/month/space/initials/o1/space/title.jpg

Where: the year and month refer to the date at which the photograph was taken followed by your initials. Use o1 for your first entry and o2 for your second and finally the title of your image. Do not use the "/" in your image name it is only used to differentiate between sections. If you are unsure how to do resize or rename your image please contact Jenny Utting for assistance.

Results of Judging

1st and 2nd place getters from each category of the 6 meeting nights will be judged in both of the separate categories (workshop and open) and winners announced at the final meeting attracting a substantial prize each.
